



Brampton Youth Soccer Club operates a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for Harassment.

Harassment of anyone by players, coaches and parents will not be tolerated. Anyone reported will be required to attend a Discipline Hearing.

Note: Harassment shall mean any comment, conduct, or gesture directed toward an individual or group of individuals, which is insulting, intimidating, humiliating, malicious, degrading or offensive. Harassment means inappropriately exerting power over another person. Harassment occurs along a continuum that ranges from mild conduct such as gestures or commands to conduct which may be physical, forceful, and violent. In certain forms, harassment may be a criminal offense.

8 Discipline

- 8.1 Coaches who are reported by means of a Special Incident Report (SIR) by the Game official will automatically serve a two (2) game Suspension,
- 8.2 Coaches reported by a Third Party, will require both a meeting with the Person submitting the complaint, followed by a meeting with the Coach. Once all the evidence is collected a decision will be made regarding any Discipline to be applied
- 8.3 A Second Seasonal Offence Coaching Privileges will be revoked
- 8.4 Players
 - 1) Any House League player ejected (red card) from a game by the Referee is automatically suspended from participating in the remainder of that game and for the next game, whether this be a league game or a cup game. The length of the suspension may be extended by the Discipline Committee if deemed appropriate.
 - 2) Any House League player accumulating THREE (3) cautions (yellow cards) during the season is automatically suspended from participating in the next game of the season whether this be a league game or a cup game.
